**Spanish uses two different forms of the pronoun you.**

**1. *Tú* (informal or familiar use) is used when referring to someone you call by first name: a sibling, a classmate, a close friend, or a child younger than yourself.**

**2. *Usted* (Ud.) (formal or polite use) is used when referring to someone with a title, an older person, a stranger, or a person of authority.**
